# THEME:

The sights and sounds, the feeling, textures and rhythms of pigs. This is a film to delight and awaken the senses, and to provoke the young intellect as well.

# CONTENT:

Dawn: a farm – a timid sparrow peers into a dim barn – sounds of heavy breathing. Blimp-like, rotund shapes stir – awaken – arise – Pigs!

Pell-mell, the **piglets suckle**, racing and tumbling; The farmer comes, **leeding time**; pigs chomping, gnashing, slopping; the farmer goes into the fields.

**Pigs of all kinds** – red pigs, black pigs, white pigs, sausage shapes, sleek shapes. *Pig faces* – shy, belligerent, tiny eyes, perky ears, swooping snouts.

Pigs scratching; playing; wrestling;

Pigs grunting, squealing, snapping, groaning;

Pig-parts: *teet, ears* of all shapes, *tails* curly and straight, *snouts* sniffing, poking, exploring, rooting.

*Mud* – digging, wallowing in the ooze, ahhh!

Nap-time; *pigs resting* by themselves, in pairs, in piles, sighing and snoring.

**Pigs in the poppies** — a pig dream? — the piglets and sow gambol out to sniff the world beyond the barnyard.

# SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES:

Oral Language: The film told a story in pictures. Tell the story in words.

Think of colorful words to express moments in the film.

# Written Language:

Write a story about how you would like to be (or not be) a pig.

You might like to write a class poem about pigs.

Read some stories about pigs, such as CHARLOTTE'S WEB by E. B. White.

# Art:

The film has many vivid images. What impressed you most about the way pigs look? What colors are pigs? How do you suppose their skin feels; their snouts? What shapes are they?

# **Rhythms:**

Pigs have strong rhythms – scratching, eating, fighting, running, lumbering, slumbering. How many kinds of pig sounds can you remember?

# Science:

How does a pig's body serve its needs? – feet – shout – ears – eyes, etc. Why is the snout so large?

Why do pigs wallow? Should we expect animals to act like people? How do pigs spend most of their time?

# Social Studies:

Why does the farmer keep pigs? What other animals does he have? What other activities?

# Health:

What is the rhythm of the pigs' day? How do they balance their activities?
